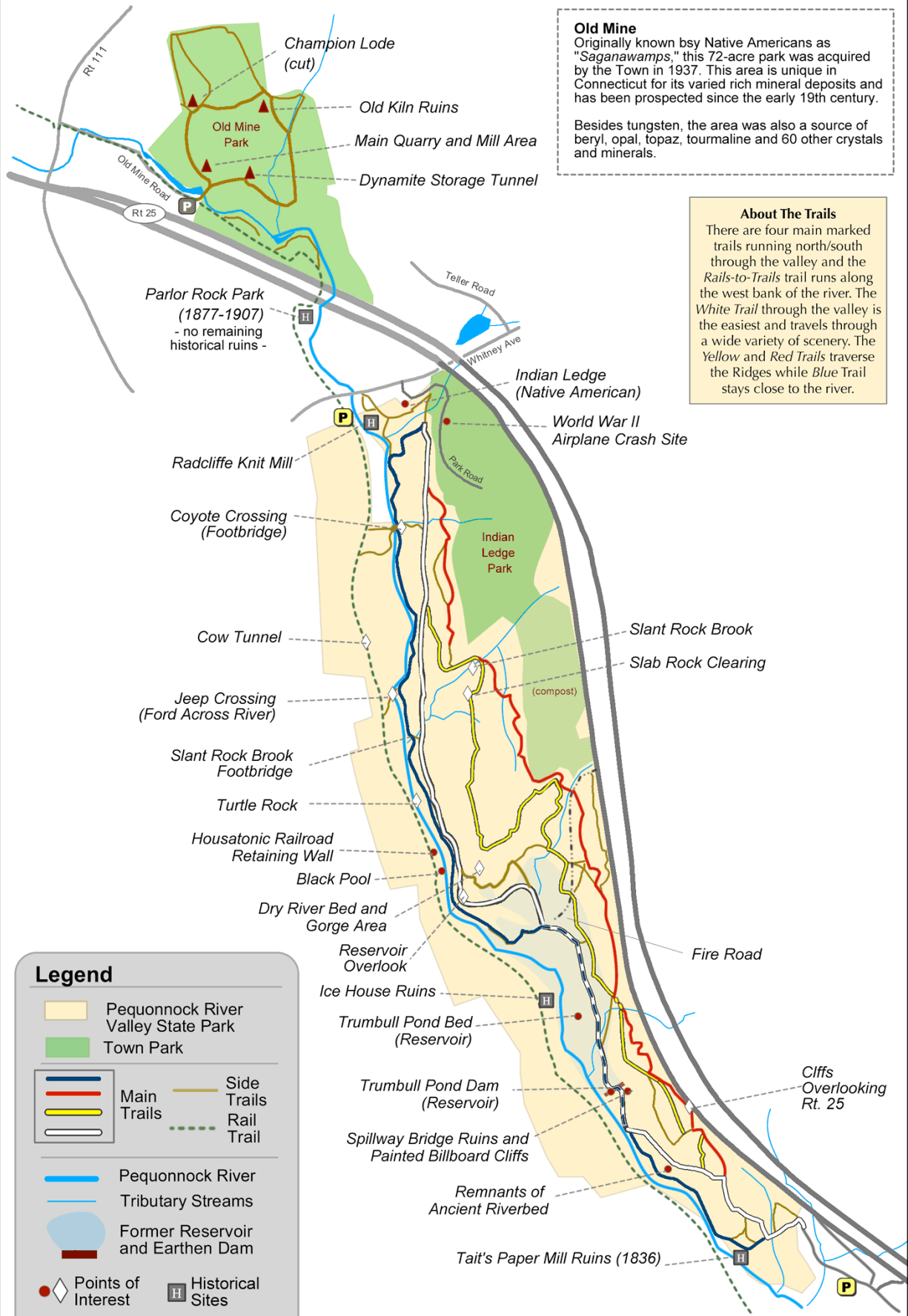


PEQUONNOCK RIVER VALLEY - TRUMBULL, CT



Old Mine

Originally known by Native Americans as "Saganawamps," this 72-acre park was acquired by the Town in 1937. This area is unique in Connecticut for its varied rich mineral deposits and has been prospected since the early 19th century.

Besides tungsten, the area was also a source of beryl, opal, topaz, tourmaline and 60 other crystals and minerals.

About The Trails

There are four main marked trails running north/south through the valley and the Rails-to-Trails trail runs along the west bank of the river. The White Trail through the valley is the easiest and travels through a wide variety of scenery. The Yellow and Red Trails traverse the Ridges while Blue Trail stays close to the river.
